RMU 2014 Update **November 4, 2013**

Railroad Modeling University 2014 is shaping up to be one of the best the Carolina Southern Division has ever offered. Several area clubs are represented by the 18 local model railroaders that will be clinicians this year. Three of them (Fred Miller, Jack Parker, and Stephen Wood are Master Model Railroaders).

For the first time a nationally recognized model railroad author, photographer, and clinician will be one of our presenters. Lou Sassi will deliver his featured presentation titled "My Two Most Memorable Layout Shoots" during lunch, so that all attendees have a chance to hear him speak. He will also provide a clinic on "Roadways For Your Railways". He comes highly recommended as a clinician by some of our members that have heard him speak at other events. everyone will welcome him and his wife Chervl to our Charlotte area community of model railroaders. We have invited him to have some of his autographed books for sale during his visit with us.

Another guest speaker this year is **Don** Canterna a former Vice President for Operations at Lionel Corporation. Don served in this capacity during the 1990s, when Lionel was bought by Neil Young, the singer, and a couple more investors. During some of that time Don led significant changes at the company because the investors were searching for a new CEO. He will share some of those stories of change and explain Lionel's manufacturing priorities to us. His talk during one of the regular monthly meetings of the CSD was very popular and generated many questions from the members attending. The CSD is happy he accepted our invitation to repeat his talk at RMU.

The CSD is adding a new feature at RMU 2014. Two of our members will be available all day to act as "Train Doctors". Bring equipment that is not running the way you expect it to, and they will do their best to help you determine what is wrong with it. If it is a simple repair (like cleaning) you may leave with properly operating equipment. Otherwise, they will do their best to provide guidance about what is wrong and how it can be repaired. They will also be able to show you how to replace/repair couplers, trucks, and wheelsets. Expect to pay for the cost of materials if you want to learn how to perform these tasks. The Train Doctors are most experienced with HO scale, but test tracks for N, S, and O will also be available. Choose "Train Doctor" as one of your classes if you want to take advantage of this offering. Registrants will receive priority over "walk ins".

Again this year, the CSD achievement program director (Dave Chance) will be available for NMRA Achievement Program judging. He will have three MMRs helping him. Contact Dave to schedule your model/s for judging.

October Division Meeting

The October Division meeting at the Mooresville HobbyTown featured Fred Miller showing how to set up a simple automated model railroad operation. Something like this could be used for a public display, operation of a commuter train or trolley repeating the same route constantly, or through trains running between staging areas as a background to other operations.

Several devices are available for DC operations like this, but Fred used DCC, a laptop computer, JMRI software with some simple custom scripts, and a Locobuffer to interface to the DCC system.


He used infrared detectors to sense where the train is and trigger actions in the scripts. Commercial boards are available for the detectors also, but Fred designed his own board that cost about \$12 in parts. To avoid interference from background light, the signal to the infrared transmitter is encoded and the receiver can distinguish it from background.



Fred has his demonstration track set up to run train back and forth automatically.

The detector outputs are connected to a DS64 stationary decoder which translates them to Loconet messages sent back to the JMRI system.

JMRI Panel Pro provides supporting tools for developing the system. The track schematic can be assembled with graphics of the devices. It can be told to run scripts in several ways and sample scripts are provided as a start to customize. The
